#### National Coding Week 18<sup>th</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup> September

Throughout school - from Nursery to Year six, children took part in various activities involving coding. Some of these activities were unplugged which simply means that they took place without using hardware - such as an iPad.

Nursery and EYFS completed some activities inside the classroom and outside to get their friends to follow instructions to get to certain places.

Year 1 had a lot of fun completing some dance routines - giving their friends coded instructions to follow to complete a set routine. They then out this code to the Black Eyed Peas music - I've got a feeling!

Year 2 learned how to create and follow code like a robot. They learned that an algorithm is a list of step by step instructions that a computer follows in order to get a task done. We used robot language such as 'control', 'looks', 'motion' and 'sound' to follow and create our own algorithms.

Year 3 were busy coding T-rex to make it move in different directions. They also added music - their poor teachers!

Year 4 were looking at different codes and then they had to 'debug' them to fix coding problems. Debugging is when errors are fixed in a computer code.

Year 5 were busy playing an online coding game called Code Monkey and Year Six were busy learning about the basics of game development and fundamental programming concepts.

It was fantastic to take part in National Coding Week that gave all of our children an insight into how computers work and how we can all use code.

#### School Uniform

We would like to remind parents/carers of Emmaville's school uniform:

The uniform consists of a purple sweatshirt or sweatshirt cardigan with the school logo, light grey polo shirt with the school logo, grey trousers, grey shorts, grey skirts or a grey pinafore. Please note skirts should be regular school skirts and not fashion skirts. In the summer purple and white gingham checked dresses may be worn.

Information and order forms for uniform are available on the school website.

In keeping with uniform and the colours of the school, plain white or grey socks (ankle or knee high only) should be worn. Please ensure that no fashion socks are worn by the children. Plain grey tights may also be worn.

Black shoes are worn in school; sandshoes are worn for indoor P.E. and trainers may be worn for outdoor P.E. but not for school.

The wearing of nail varnish is not allowed. Nor is the wearing of earrings or other items of jewellery. For health and safety reasons no earrings should be worn for school, nor should children wear earrings with plasters covering them or with plastic retainers in their ears. No responsibility can be accepted by the school for jewellery or watches lost on the premises.

Long hair should be tied back for Health and Safety reasons. Ribbons, bobbles, hairbands and slides should be small and simple in style and only in the school colours of purple or grey. Hairstyle colour should be suitable for primary school children. Please note that no extreme or fashion hairstyles (shaved or tram lines) or braids are permitted.

It is now school policy, that on PE days pupils should come to school in their PE kit. The school PE kit consists of: black shorts, white T-shirt (summer), socks and sandshoes (indoor) or trainers (outdoor) black tracksuits or leggings, jogging bottoms and black sweatshirts (outdoor).

Please note, no fashion-branded PE kit should be worn.

Year 5, will go swimming in 2023/24 and these pupils will need swimwear and a towel and should come to school dressed in their purple uniform. A small group of Year 6 pupils may also go swimming during the school year. A letter will be sent home informing parents when their child will be going swimming. The uniform policy can be found on the school website.


