Nursery Admissions 2018-2019

Do you have a child that is turning three this year or know someone that has?

We are currently sending out application forms for our Nursery for children that are eligible to start in either September 2018; January 2019 or April 2019.

The September 2018 intake is for children born between
1st September 2014 and August 31st 2015.

The January 2019 intake is for children born between
1st September 2015 and 31st December 2015.

The April 2019 intake is for children born between
1st January 2016 and 31st March 2016.

Our intake in January 2019 and April 2019 will be dependent on the demand for places in September 2018.

We offer 30 hour funded places from 9am until 3pm Monday to Friday for children that are eligible. To check eligibility please use the Government 'Childcare Choices' website.

We also offer 15 hour places in patterns of either mornings, afternoons or two and a half days.

Please telephone school to request an application form or pick one up from the school office as soon as possible.
