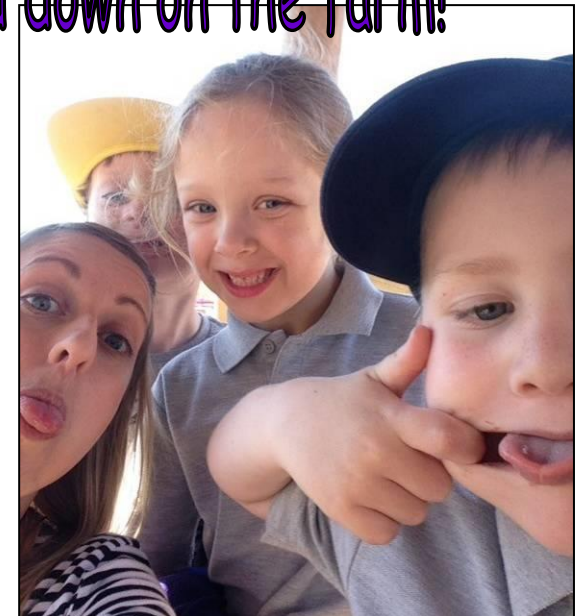
On Monday, Nursery and Reception enjoyed a gloriously sunny day at Hall Hill Farm.
