- RWInc. Phonics sessions: Learning set 1 Sounds, using them to blend and segment words for reading and writing.
- Daily reading activities based upon the themes of: families, autumn and winter and tackling changes and challenges.

Maths

As mathematicians we will:



- Understand 'How Many?' - counting accurately using one to one correspondence.
- Practice correct number formation
- Practice numeral recognition
- Ordering numbers 0-20
- Adding / subtracting using practical apparatus
- Recognise and describe shapes in the environment
- Look at positional language using practical apparatus.
- Begin to learn the days of the week / months of the year / seasons / times of day.

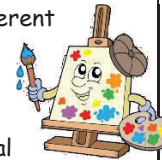

Expressive arts and design

As artists, musicians and in imaginary play we will:

Study the works of Andy Goldsworthy - learning about transient art and generating our own outdoor transient art.
Study the works of Richard Long - make our own handprint based class artwork.
Printing and sculptures with natural materials
Investigate colour mixing using a range of different paints and materials.
Make clay Diwali divas.
Christmas crafts
Music - learn songs and experiment with musical instruments linked to that week's sounds in phonics.
(For example = 's' = steel pans and 'Ten Fat Sausages'.

Health and Self Care:

Understanding of the world

In learning about people, the world and technology we will:

Learn about our new classmates, their families and how we are similar and different.

Go on our first visit to Clara Vale - to recognise how our environment changes in the autumn. To explore the community orchard, discovering where our food comes from. Picking apples and turning them into apple juice using an apple press.

Investigate trees / leaves and colour changing
Investigate the Harvest Festival

Weekly baking / cooking sessions to see how ingredients change during different cooking processes.

Learning about the festival of Christmas and different traditions.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development



Devise class 'Golden Rules'; talking about their importance and consequences.

Playing collaboration, parachute, ring and name games.

Show and Tell / Review sessions to help the children develop their self-confidence and self-awareness within a group.

Introduce a 'Growth Mindset' mentality into the classroom through books and puppets.
