School Uniform

Please make sure that children always wear the correct uniform. For example, black shoes on purple uniform days, white T shirts and black sweatshirts on P.E. kit days.

Emmaville uniform consists of a purple sweatshirt or sweatshirt cardigan with the school logo, light grey polo shirt with the school logo, grey trousers, grey shorts, grey skirts or a grey pinafore. Please note skirts should be regular school skirts and not fashion skirts. In the summer purple and white gingham checked dresses may be worn.

In keeping with uniform and the colours of the school, plain white or grey socks (ankle or knee high only) should be worn. Please ensure that no fashion socks are worn by the children. Plain <u>grey</u> tights may also be worn.

Black shoes are worn in school; sandshoes are worn for indoor P.E. and trainers may be worn for outdoor P.E. but not for school.

The wearing of nail varnish is not allowed. Nor is the wearing of earrings or other items of jewellery. For health and safety reasons no earrings should be worn for school, nor should children wear earrings with plasters covering them. No responsibility can be accepted by the school for jewellery or watches lost on the premises.

Hairstyles colour and accessories should be suitable for primary school children. Please note that no extreme or fashion hairstyles (shaved or tram lines) are permitted.

Pupils are asked to supply a suitable change of clothing for games and sports. These should be: black shorts, white T-shirt (summer), socks and sandshoes (indoor) or trainers (outdoor) black tracksuits or leggings, jogging bottoms and black sweatshirts (winter).



Next week, we are supporting Safer Internet Day, which is being held on Tuesday 7^{th} February. It is held all over the world to help people think about how they use the internet and technology.

This year the theme is **Want to talk about it?**Making space for conversations about life online. 
