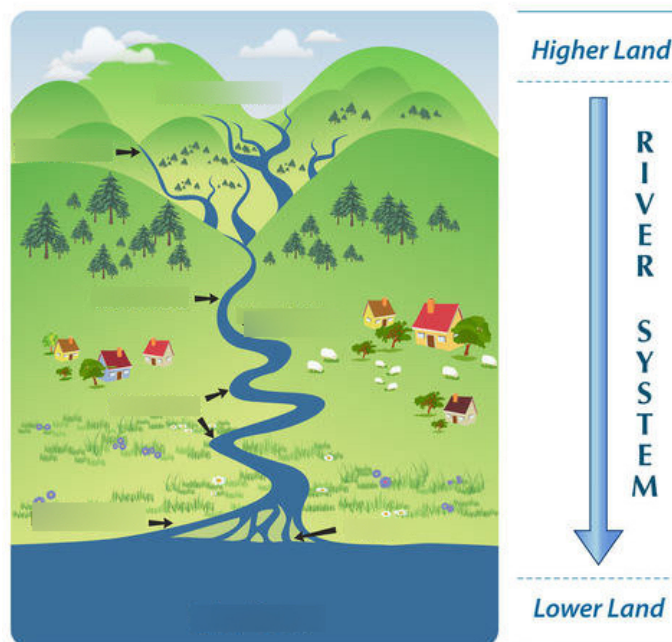


LO: To use atlases to identify rivers around the world

Think back to last lesson; what do you remember about the journey of a river and its different features?

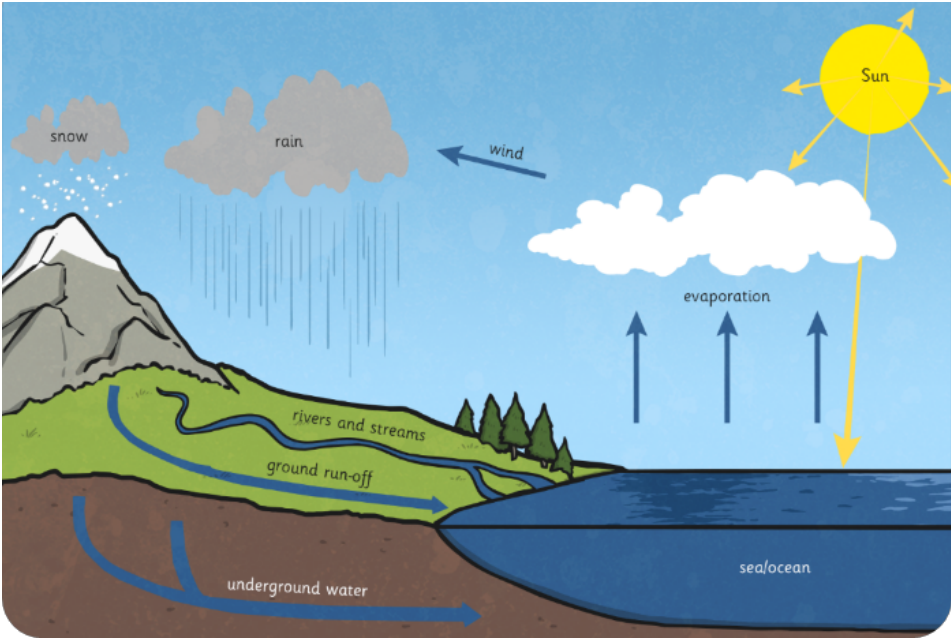
Features of a River

Some rivers flow into lakes, some rivers flow into other rivers and some river flow into the sea.



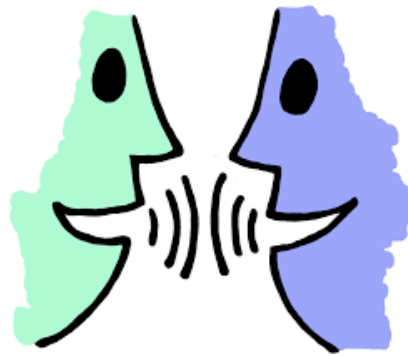
Have a look at this map of the River Tyne.
