Medicines in school

The administration of medicines in school policy has recently been reviewed and updated, this can now be found on the school website. However, below is a section that has been taken from the updated policy. The section taken from the policy highlights the medications that will be administered in school.

Medicines will only be administered that have been prescribed by a doctor or some other authorised person and where it would be detrimental to a child's health if the medicine were not administered during the day. In school, medicine will only be administered if it has been prescribed by a doctor to be taken 4 times a day.

Medicines that have been prescribed 3 times a day should be administered at home, before school in the morning, after school and before bed.

Parents/Carers can make arrangements to visit school at lunch time to administer non - prescribed medication to their child.

If during the school day, staff feel that a child is a little unwell, then **non-prescription medicines** may be administered by staff, once they have received permission from the child's parent.

Remembrance

The children throughout school have been working very hard to contribute to the Remembrance display in the hall. We wanted to show a progression of art skills from Reception to Year 6 around the theme of 'Never Forget'. I think the children have certainly accomplished that as I have been totally blown away by the cutting and crafting skills that have gone into the poppy and remembrance designs. We certainly have some creative, imaginative and skilled children at Emmaville. The display will be completed by the end of the week so please take time to pop into the hall to see their wonderful work. Poppies will also be going on sale this week so it will be good to see the children wearing their poppies with pride.
