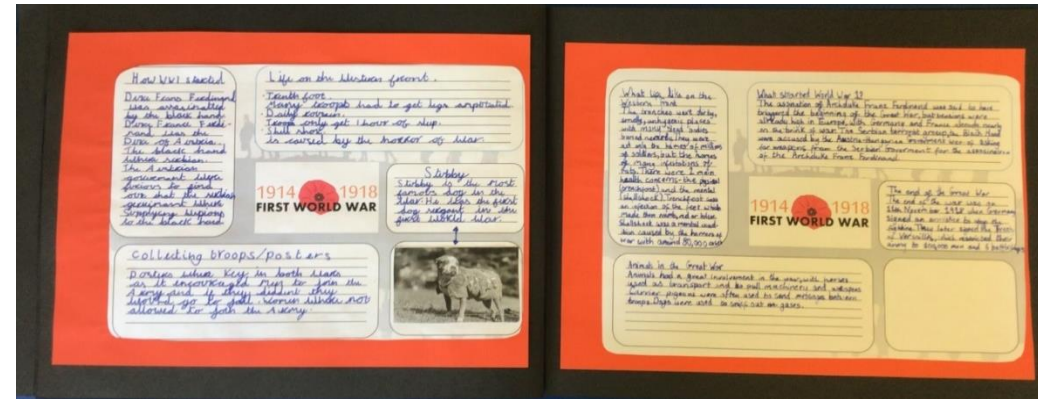
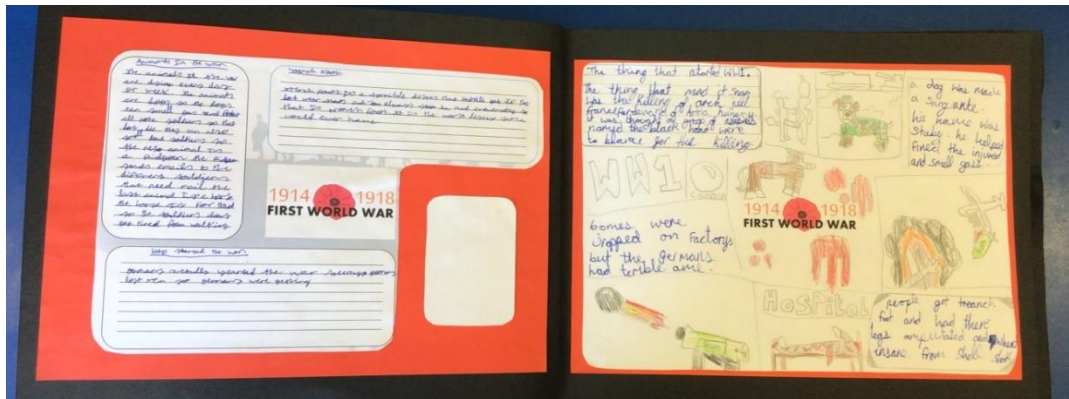
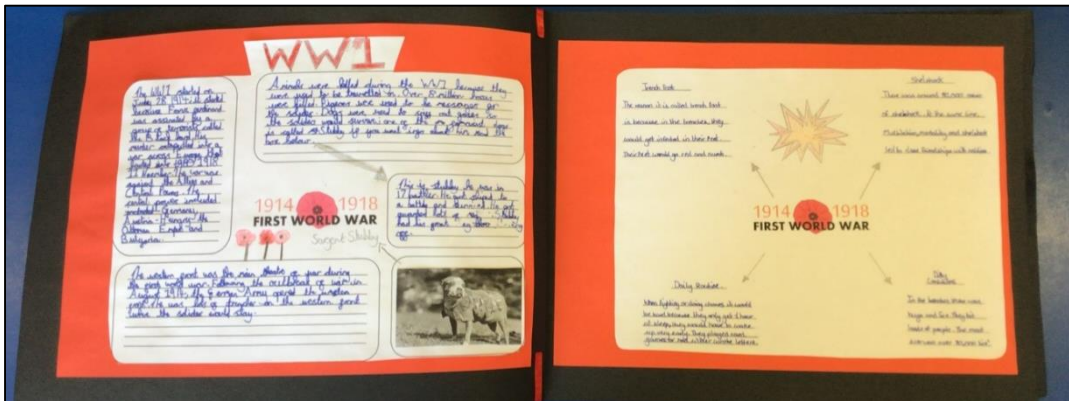
#### Antarctica's Fact file of The Great War

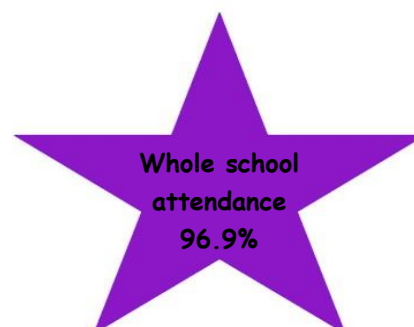

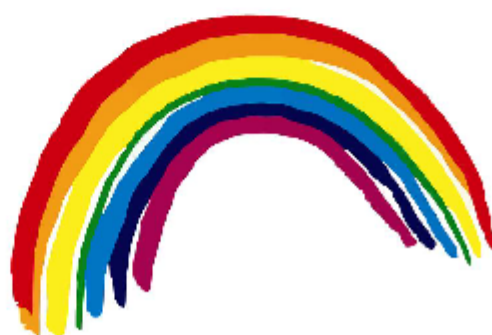
