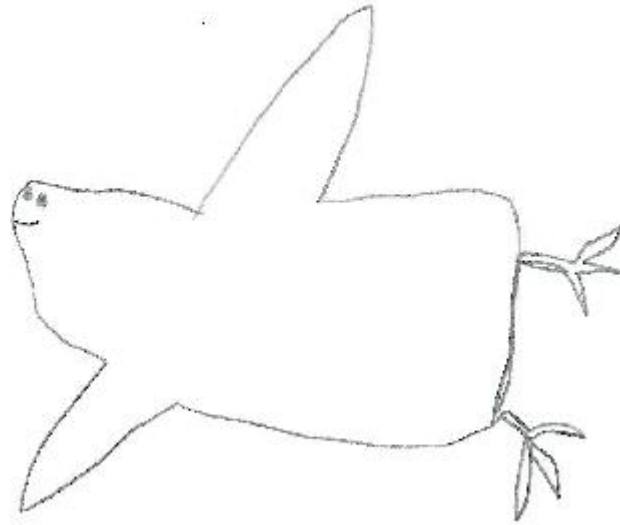

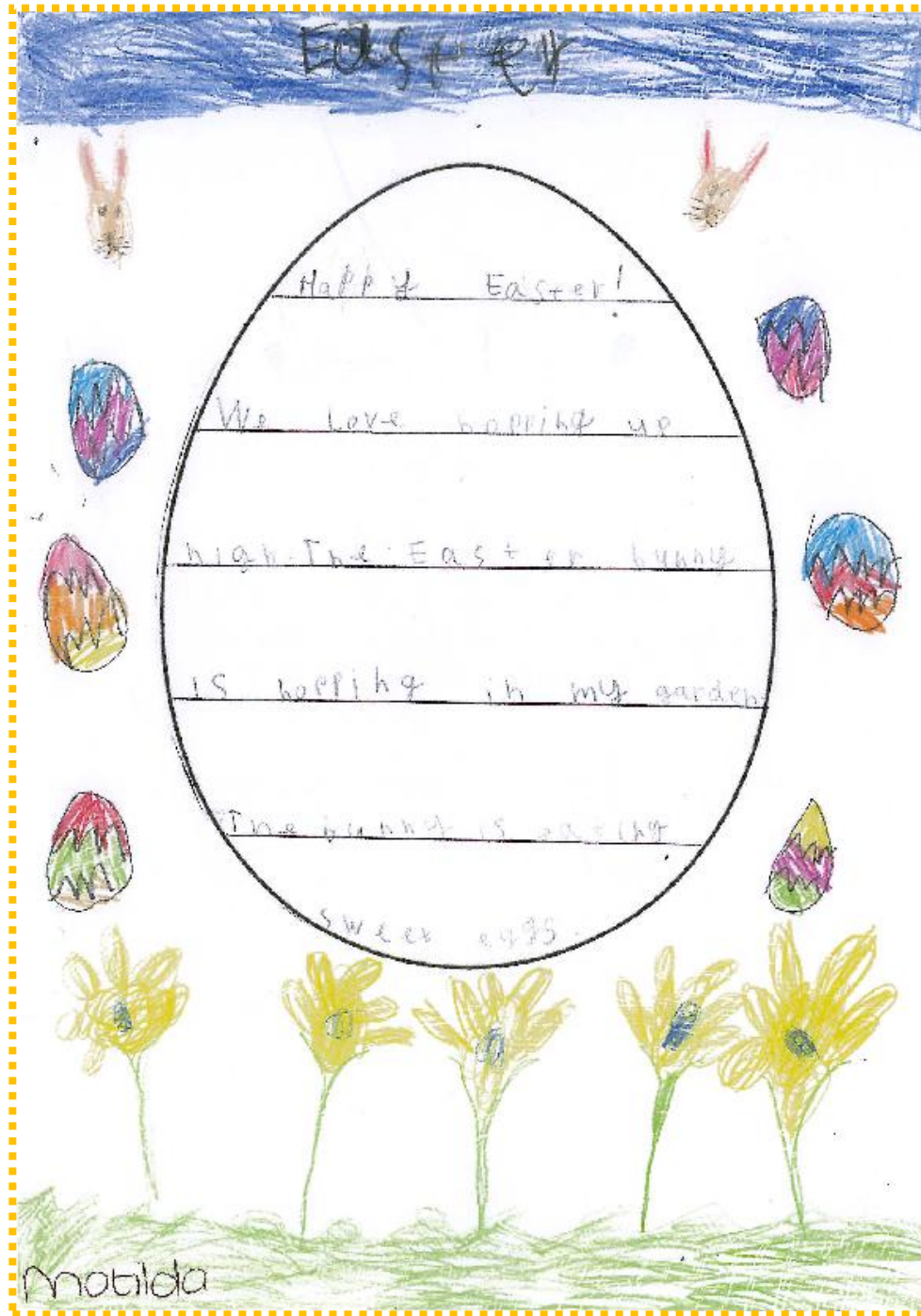

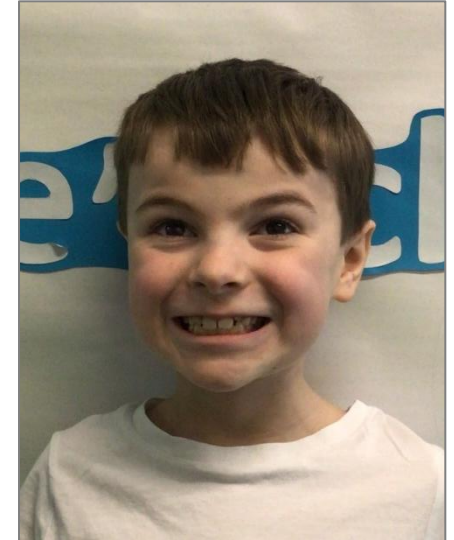


Should every child have a pet?

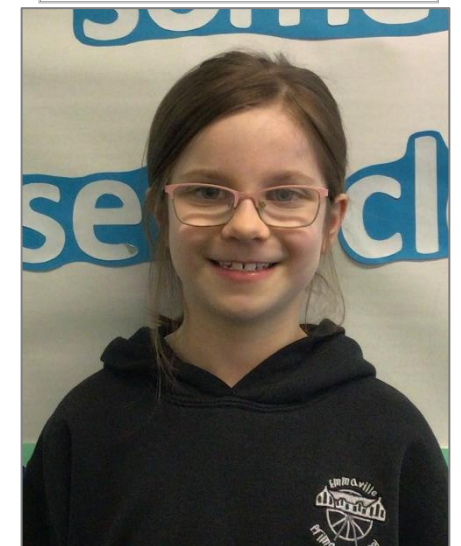

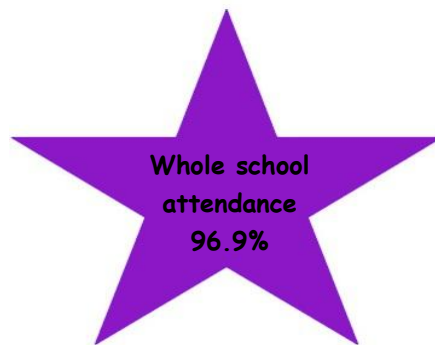
