Human processes

Although two major cities (Toronto and Moscow) are located in the taiga biome, most of it is uninhabited. As such, you would think that it would be little impacted by human processes. Unfortunately, the taiga forests are endangered due to logging and mining, in particular, open cast tar sands mining. When trees are cut down in the taiga, it takes a long time for new trees to grow because of the short growing season meaning that the forests are not replenished. This has impacts not only on the number of trees but also habitats, and more importantly, global warming due to the reduced capacity to absorb carbon.
