e.g. In the sentence, 'Watch out for the dog!' the noun 'dog' can be expanded to 'the flea-bitten dog that is baring its teeth and running towards us', which gives us a lot more information about the dog (and why we need to look out for it).

Some other examples are below

The clatter of **hooves** on the cobbles.

A giant of <u>a man</u> with snarling nostrils the size of boulders.

A towering **horse** that pawed the ground.

Wolfish **eyes** that froze the courage in a man's veins
