

# Communication and Language & Literacy As speakers, listeners, readers and writers we will:

Complete daily reading activities based upon Pie Corbett Reading Spine books: Dear Zoo, We're going on a Bear Hunt, Brown Bear, Spot the Dog. Use Talk For Writing techniques such as text maps, physical movements and repeated retellings to learn key texts.

Listen and respond to themed texts such as: Rainbow Fish, Rosie's Walk, Monkey Puzzle, Rumble in the Jungle, Commotion in the Ocean, Superworm.

Talk about our favourite animals and state why they're our favourites.



### Maths

#### As mathematicians we will:

Be comparing how much containers can hold and using language related to capacity.

Be using, ordering and writing numbers up to 10.

Be investigating different 2d shapes.

Use prepositional language about where the class animal is hiding.

Be voting for our favourite animal and making a simple graph to show the most popular animals.

Be looking at animal patterns.

Investigate symmetry with painted butterfly pictures Make animal masks and other child initiated role play resources.


Sing a range of animal songs.

# Physical development

<u>Malleable materials activities</u>: porridge goo, dough, jelly, clay, marshmallow playdough, porridge dough, slime, gloop, moon sand, sand, rice and shaving foam.

# Understanding of the world In learning about people, the world and technology we will:

Investigate animal habitats, at a local, national and international scale.

Take part in mini beast hunts.

Life cycles of chicks and caterpillars and frogs with real life examples

What do seeds need to grow? - Investigate (put 1 in the dark, 1 no water, 1 no soil, 1 no air, 1 with water, air, light and soil).

Plant broad beans in transparent jars & observe their growth.

Look at nocturnal animals.

Make our own womery.

Think about caring for animals and creatures.

Participate in 'Welly Wednesdays' - outdoor learning through Forest School style activities in the school grounds.

Grow potatoes in bucket/ cherry tomato plants / radish/ lettuce, Create an outdoor sensory area in a tub
