GSSP - Orienteering Festival

On Thursday, Miss Dixon and I had the pleasure of taking 18 Year 3 children to the Gateshead School Sports Partnership Orienteering Festival at Kingsmeadow Community School. We were blessed with glorious sunshine for the afternoon which was, dare I say it, a little too hot! With sun cream on and sun hats and water bottles at the ready, we were split into 2 groups.

One group was given a map of the site with numbered locations. The children worked in pairs and took it in turns to use the map to lead the way. Once at the location, they found a tag with a number and a word which had to be recorded on a chart. We were really impressed with how the children lead the group in pairs and how the rest of the group allowed them to do so without jumping in if they thought they'd made an error. It gave everyone the opportunity to practise their navigational map skills.

The other group worked as a whole team on several problem-solving activities. There was a minefield activity, where the children had to use memory and deduction skills to cross a grid and remember what their team mates had done. There was a fantastic drainpipe activity where the children had different lengths of drain pipe that they had to connect together to try to let a ball run along them. The drainpipes where much shorter than the distance the ball needed to travel, so the children had to run to the other side to connect their pipe before the ball rolled onto the floor! There was a blindfold activity where they had to lead each other with clapped commands. There was also an activity that involved trying to balance several nails on a block of wood. Again, we were really impressed with how the children allowed each other to make their own decision about how to place their nail. The two groups then swapped over and completed the other activity.

A fantastic afternoon was had by all and Miss Dixon and I were incredibly impressed with our Emmavillians' brilliant team work and excellent attitude!

Grace - South America 1st Place for Classical trio & highest mark for 9/12 duet/trio


> Emily - South America 1st Place for Novice Classical solo
