Well done Emmaville footballers.



At some point over the next few weeks in class, you will be working on and presenting your speech to the rest of the class. For this theme, think about how you see yourself as an adult. Think about what you enjoy doing and what you are good at. Is there something you are passionate about?

For the younger children, it might be something as simple as I'd like to be a nurse because I want to make people better. For the older children, they might think about a particular role/job or alternatively a more abstract concept, for example:

- a quality they would like to have e.g. kind, brave, supportive or
- a skill they would like to use e.g. working in a team, encouraging others or

• an aim they have e.g. protecting the environment, ending food poverty Think about why you want this? What will you do now to help you get there?

#### <u>TOP TIPS! These are the things the judges are going to be</u> <u>looking for:</u>

- Think about who your audience is. Can you make it interesting to them?
- Use interesting or technical vocabulary.
- VOICE: pace, varying your tone, pronouncing words clearly and projecting your voice.
- BODY LANGUAGE: gesture and posture, facial expression and eye contact.
