Introducing the new Gateshead SEND Thresholds

We would like to invite you to a parent information session (with complimentary biscuits!) on **Tuesday 1**st **October 2024 at 6:00pm** to introduce the new Gateshead SEND Thresholds.

The SEND Thresholds provide a framework to support identification of needs, curriculum adaptation, guidance on assessment and the deployment of resources. The Thresholds are based on the four areas of the SEND Code of Practice (cognition and learning, communication and interaction, social emotional and mental health and sensory/physical) and gives practical guidance and ideas from Early Years to Post 19.

It also includes the Preparation for Adulthood (PfA) outcomes (employment/training, independence, good health and community inclusion) from the Early Years through to 25 years of age, under each area of need. These have been written in consultation with education, health, social care and parents, carers and young people.

The meeting will give you the opportunity to see a copy of the SEND Thresholds, understand how you can use them to support your child and ask any questions you may have. For any parents who would like to know more but can't attend, a summary video about the Thresholds will be posted on the school website after the meeting and a link will be provided.




If your child has sickness and/or diarrhoea, they must stay off school for 48 hours after the last bout of the illness.
