- A glimmer of hope

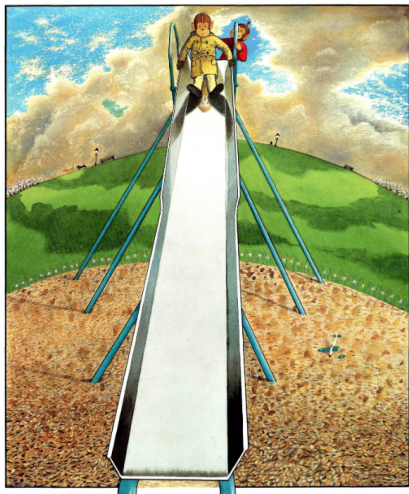
Imagine you were at the park on the same day as the four voices.
