Is there any conflict between these last two groups?




We are all different and belong to different groups. We all need to belong and need to celebrate our uniqueness and specialness, as well as our similarities and differences.

<u>Sometimes</u>, people allow differences to cause conflict.




### **Culture Wheel**






Where do you think each child lives? Why?
