
What would that job involve?

Did the book give you any ideas about your ideal job, or make you change your mind?



Fortunately, there is a great website that you can use called 'First Careers', which you can access by clicking on 'Kids' Zone' on the school website.






With a partner, use the website to research your dream job. You can search by job title, by subject (e.g. geography) or by brand.
