




Pets are loved by children and their families. Some people agree that children should have pets and some disagree. This argument will look into detail at the reasons for and against.


One of the main arguments for children having a pet is for company. You can play with them and cuddle them. Also taking a pet for a walk gives you exercise.

#### My Best Birthday...Ever!


