We were formed at the beginning of this term and our role is to listen and highlight the experiences of pupils at Emmaville and bring about positive change to our school, our wider community and even communities around the world!

We are encouraged to speak freely and openly, sharing ours and our friends' experiences of being a pupil at Emmaville, including what works and what could make things better.

We've had a really busy, but positive, term so far. In November we met with Alex Thompson from Gateshead Council who is currently in the process of developing a Transitions Guide for children, young people, and parent/carers in Gateshead. The aim of the guide is to try to ensure that transitions between schools, year groups and key stages of education are smoother and people feel more informed at each stage. We worked with Alex and gave him our thoughts and feelings about how we feel when we move up through school and how we feel about moving to secondary school, which won't be too far off for some of us! We also gave him some of our ideas about how our experiences could be improved.

We have also been promoting Fairtrade at our school as we have been a Fairtrade school for over 11 years now, and helping communities that don't have the same opportunities as us is really important to us. We found out all about the history of Fairtrade and the Co-op who are proudly celebrating over 30 years of supporting Fairtrade since the very beginning in 1994. We met with Jordan, one of the managers of the Co-op, who gave us a tour of their new store which is just next to our school. We looked at all of the Fairtrade products and even brought some small cakes back to school to sell to raise funds for Fairtrade.

We have more work planned for the Spring term with our school and our community and will continue to keep you updated.
