Pilgrim Fathers set sail from Plymouth in the *Mayfair* (6<sup>th</sup> September 1620) sailed to Massachusetts

Sir Francis Drake set sail from Plymouth in the *Golden Hind* (1577) to fight in the Spanish Armada

Norwich founded as a small Anglo Saxon settlement

York was founded by the Romans

**Explorers:** Captain Cook, Sir Francis Drake, Neil Armstrong, David Attenborough

**Architects:** Christopher Wren

**Inventors:** The Wright Brothers (first powered aircraft)

**Engineer:** George Stephenson (Victorian) Important during the Industrial Revolution because of his work on locomotives. He also designed a safety lamp for miners to use, referred to as a 'Geordie'

**Physicist/chemist:** Marie Curie (First woman to win the Nobel Prize)

**Social Reformers/Missionaries:** Florence Nightingale, Elizabeth Fry (Prison Reforms), Mother Teresa (Won a Nobel Peace Prize)

**Authors:** Beatrix Potter (writer, illustrator, natural scientist and conservationist) Roald Dahl (was a pilot in the Second World War, author, poet and screenwriter)

### Timeline

Norman Conquest - 1066 (Battle of Hastings, King Harold and William the Conqueror, Duke of Normandy)

Henry VIII (1491 - 1547)

Elizabeth 1 (1533 - 1603)

Sir Francis Drake (1540 - 1596) Spanish Armada

Mary Queen of Scots (1542 - 1587) Gave birth to her only child, James 1, in Edinburgh Castle

Gunpowder Plot - 1605 - James 1 was King in the time of the Gunpowder Plot. He was also the first Stuart King

Christopher Wren (1632 - 1723) Designed buildings following the Great Fire of London. Architect of St. Paul's Cathedral

Great Fire of London - 1666

Captain James Cook (1728 - 1779) Born in Marton-in-Cleveland, died and is buried in Kealahou Bay in Hawaii. He explored the eastern coastline of Australia, naming it New South Wales, and 2 of Cook's ships sailed close to the Antarctic coast but were forced back by the cold. James Cook also explored Hawaii

Elizabeth Fry (1780 - 1845) Born in Norwich

George Stephenson (1781 - 1848) Born in Wylam

Florence Nightingale (1820 - 1910) Victorian/Edwardian era

Emmeline Pankhurst (1858 - 1928) Born in Manchester

Beatrix Potter (1866 - 1943) Victorian/Edwardian/First World War/Second World War. Spent a considerable amount of her life living in the Lake District

Marie Curie (1867 - 1934)

Winston Churchill (1874 - 1965)

The first modern Olympic Games - 1896 held in Athens, Greece

The first aeroplane flight - 1903, Wilbur and Orville Wright, Kitty Hawk, North Carolina

Mother Teresa (1910 - 1997) Missionary in India, died in Calcutta

The sinking of the Titanic - Titanic built in Belfast - 1912 the voyage from Southampton to New York City

Roald Dahl (1916 - 1990) born in Wales, Llandaff, Cardiff

Nelson Mandela (1918 - 2013)

Armistice Day - 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918

### **Edwardian Era**

1901 - 1914
