

Statutory Assessments

In the summer term the children in various key stages have to be assessed through statutory assessments determined by the Government.

The Year 6 children completed their tests this week, and I would like to congratulate them all for the positive attitude and great resilience that they showed throughout the four days of tests. Pupils in Year 1 and Year 2 will be involved in statutory assessments that will take place during the months of May and June.

Pupils in Year 1 will complete a Phonic Screen Test with their teacher. This test must be completed during the week beginning the 10th June - 14th June.

Year 2 pupils will be assessed during the months of May and June.

It is very important that children have good attendance at school at all times but it is particularly crucial that they don't miss school during the weeks that tests and screens take place. Should you have any queries about any of the assessments that your child/children may be involved in during this term then please either speak to your child's/children's class teacher or get in touch with myself.

They fund equipment such as specialist beds, trikes, wheelchairs and sensory equipment. The charity is not funded and relies on the generosity of local organisations, communities and individuals to raise £450,000 annually.



Coeliac Awareness Week

As this week is Coeliac Awareness Week, Maia's mum would like to tell you a little bit about what Coeliac Disease is.

Miai was diagnosed when she was 3 years old after many hospital trips for various things and lots of tests and a biopsy, so has now lived without Gluten for a long time. It was a shock to the system making everything Gluten free and not contaminated by even the simplest thing. Maia even knows more than her parents about what she can or can't eat.

At Emmaville, Maia has Gluten free school dinners everyday and even has her own stash of sweet treats in the classroom for when other children are eating things she can't have. In Year 1 Maia made some posters to bring in to the class to explain to all of her friends about her disease and how it affects her on a daily basis.

Here is just a few facts about the Disease:

- Coeliac Disease affects 1 in 100 people in the UK
- Coeliac Disease is NOT an intolerance to Gluten, this is not an allergy
- It is a serious autoimmune disease that damages the villi of the small intestine and interferes with absorption
 of nutrients from food
- You cannot "grow out of it"
- 1 in 4 are previously misdiagnosed with IBS
