In addition to the above dates, schools will be closed to pupils on Monday 3rd May 2021 (Bank Holiday).

Two days within the above terms are to be used for professional development for staff. These dates are determined and agreed by individual school governing bodies.

In addition, one occasional day within the summer term 2021 is to be utilised for the purpose of closure for possible election purposes. This day is to be used near the end of the summer term and agreed by individual school governing bodies.

- Please note that the school is closed to pupils on Monday 19th April and Friday 28th May 2021 as these dates have been identified as professional development days for staff.
- School will also be closed on Friday 25th June 2021 (occasional day).

Assessment and Catch up

As I have previously mentioned in earlier communications, we are delighted with the way in which the children have returned to school. They have settled very well into their new classes; they are eager and enthusiastic to learn, and I have already seen some high-quality work that has been produced. All teachers have been assessing the progress of pupils through a variety of different methods and we are now in the process of identifying gaps in learning and how we can best support pupils to catch up.

Autumn Term Parents' Evening

Due to the pandemic restrictions, there will be no face to face parents' evenings in the autumn term. In the second half of the autumn term, there will be the opportunity for teachers and parents to discuss the children's progress; however, discussions will take place either by telephone or through Seesaw. Further details will be sent out at a later date.

Charitable support

On Friday 23rd October, we will be having a non-uniform event for the charity CLIC Sargent. We have been asked to support this charity by one of our families. As we currently need to be careful when handling money, class teachers will collect the donations directly from the children as they arrive at school on the morning of the 23rd. Donations will then be placed in a container with sterilising fluid.

Reception Class Admissions for September 2021
