The Sorcerer's Apprentice

We are excited to be taking the children on Wednesday 8th December to the Northern Stage to watch the performance of the Sorcerer's Apprentice. The children will leave school at 1pm and each year group will travel together on a bus so there will be no mixing of year groups.

The performance begins at 2pm and we are anticipating returning to school at 5.30pm; however, this will be dependent upon traffic so bear with us if we are running late.

Collection of children after the show

In order to reduce congestion as children are being collected when we return from the theatre, we ask that the parent/carers of Year 1 & Year 2 children wait on the front yard for the children to be dismissed.

The children in Year 3 & 4 will be dismissed from the gate leading into Crawcrook Park, and the children in Year 5 & 6 will leave from the entrance that they normally leave from at the end of a school day. Members of staff will be escorting the Year 5/6 pupils out of school to ensure that they leave the school grounds safely.

We are aware that some parents have children in each Key Stage, to support you with collections in different areas, be assured members of staff will stay with your children until you can collect them all. We ask for your patience as we have no control over which bus departs first from the Northern Stage.

Christmas Parties

Last year the children had a party style lunch, with cupcakes, biscuits and juice served to them later in the afternoon. We plan to do the same this year. The school will pay for the lunch and sweet treats on the day of the party; no payment is required from families. However, I am aware that some children prefer a packed lunch from home. Vouchers for pupils eligible for means tested free school meals

The Council has decided to provide vouchers to children eligible for means tested free school meals. The vouchers will be for the week commencing 20th December until Sunday 2nd January. School will be ordering the vouchers before the end of the autumn term.

For the Christmas 2021 holiday period, the weekly voucher value will be £30 per child (£60 in total). However, please note that future vouchers will be issued at the normal value of £15 per child per week.
