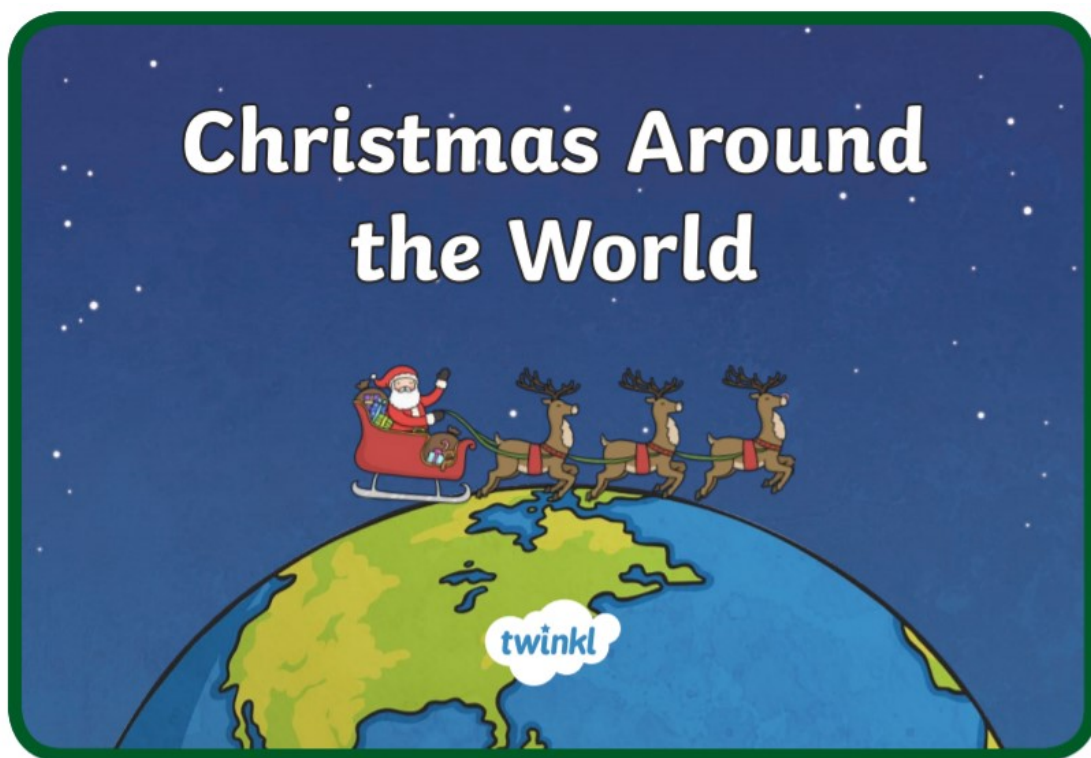


How do you think people around the world celebrate Christmas? Is it the same or different?

**LO: To write an information text (hot write)**

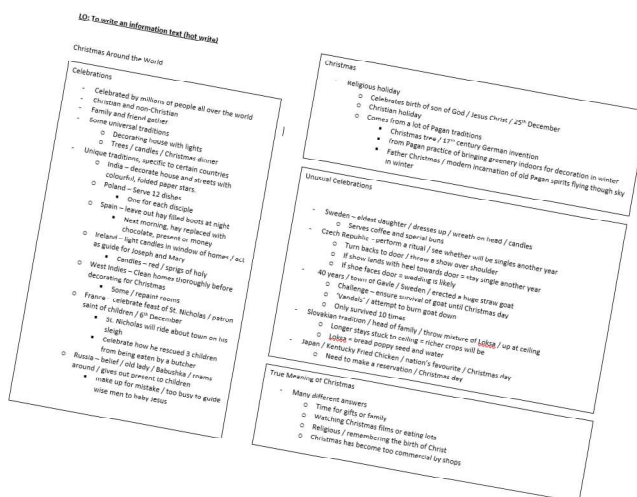
You have worked very hard to learn how to write an information text and put these ideas (and skills) into practice.

**REMEMBER**, these are **NOTES**, not full sentences. You need to make them **FULL SENTENCES** and **CONNECT** the sentences.

You should also try to use your **OWN WORDS** and change the order of the words.



## Information Text Toolkit

### **Layout:**

- Subheadings
- Sections start with a topic sentence to capture interest and define subject
- Sections may have one or more paragraphs, to mark new information, subsections etc
- More detailed definitions
- A range of interesting facts and ideas about the topic in a sequence which builds up information logically;

### **Language/sentence structure:**

- Formal style
- Expanded range of conjunctions and generalisers
- Technical vocabulary to add precision
- Varied sentence structure, length and type e.g.
  - complex sentences to combine information clearly and precisely
  - varied sentence style and length to keep the reader interested
  - use of parenthesis for additional information
