Arrival of children at school

We really appreciate how parents and children have adapted to the drop off and pickups at school; the support and cooperation has been an enormous help to us.

We would also like to remind parents of the importance of arriving at school on time each day.

Please be aware, due to the strict hand washing regimes that we have in place, class teachers need to get the children quickly into school on a morning, so that the children can wash their hands before the start of the first lesson. On some occasions, an additional adult may be available on the rear yard to allow any late comers to enter through the gates a couple of minutes after their class has entered the building; however, it is not always possible to have an adult on hand to do this. On the days that this is not possible, please take children who are late to the front of school where they can enter through the main doors.

School Uniform

Attached is a reminder of the school uniform policy. Please make sure that children always wear the correct uniform. For example, black shoes on purple uniform days, white T shirts and black sweatshirts on P.E. kit days.

Emmaville uniform consists of a purple sweatshirt or sweatshirt cardigan with the school logo, light grey polo shirt with the school logo, grey trousers, grey shorts, grey skirts or a grey pinafore. Please note skirts should be regular school skirts and not fashion skirts. In the summer purple and white gingham checked dresses may be worn.

In keeping with uniform and the colours of the school, plain white or grey socks (ankle or knee high only) should be worn. Please ensure that no fashion socks are worn by the children. Plain grey tights may also be worn.

Black shoes are worn in school; sandshoes are worn for indoor P.E. and trainers may be worn for outdoor P.E. but not for school.

The wearing of nail varnish is not allowed. Nor is the wearing of earrings or other items of jewellery. For health and safety reasons no earrings should be worn for school, nor should children wear earrings with plasters covering them. No responsibility can be accepted by the school for jewellery or watches lost on the premises.

Hairstyles colour and accessories should be suitable for primary school children. Please note that no extreme or fashion hairstyles (shaved or tram lines) or braids are permitted.

Pupils are asked to supply a suitable change of clothing for games and sports. These should be: black shorts, white T-shirt (summer), socks and sandshoes (indoor) or trainers (outdoor) black tracksuits or leggings, jogging bottoms and black sweatshirts (winter).

Personal Achievements

We are always delighted with the things that the children achieve out of school, as well as in school. We want to celebrate these achievements. However, currently we ask that children do not bring medals, trophies or certificates into school. Instead we ask that you take a photograph of the children with their medals/trophies/certificates and post the photograph on either Tapestry or Seesaw. The class teachers will then share personal achievements through this method.

School Council


