On Monday 17th January, all of the children across school celebrated World Religion Day.

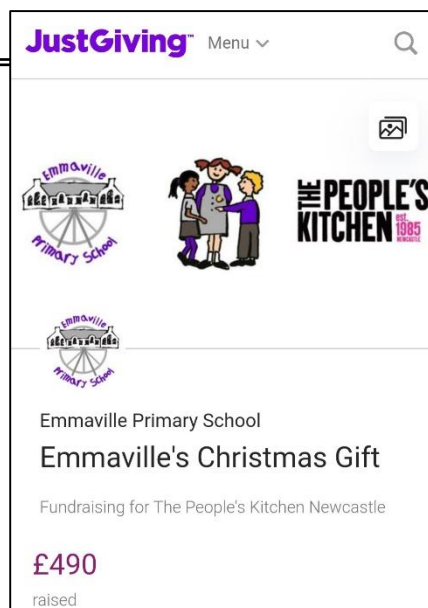
We had a wonderful time promoting interfaith understanding, harmony and things we could do to help to unite everyone whatever their faith.

We would like to say a big thank you for your wonderful contributions; you have raised a fantastic £490 (plus gift aid).

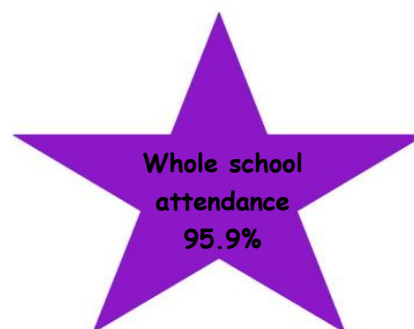
This money has been given to The People's Kitchen and is already helping provide hot meals, clothing and other support for vulnerable people.
