Arrangements for the last week of term

We have some further treats planned for next week for the children, a reminder that children in KS1 & KS2 come to school on Monday in their PE kits.

The Year 6 children are off to Flamingo Land on Tuesday, leaving school promptly at 8am. The children in North and South America will travel in two buses that will leave from the front entrance of school.

On Wednesday 21^{st} July, it is the Year 5 children's turn to go surfing and we have also booked two buses to transport them to Tynemouth.

We know that restrictions are due to lift from Monday 19th July, but we are still moving cautiously forward; hence the reason for booking two buses to avoid mixing bubbles for any of the planned outings. Until the end of the summer term, we ask that parents/carers continue to support us with the existing rules that we have in place.

We are planning on being cautious for the first three weeks of the autumn term too, and you will have received my letter regarding arrangements that was sent out on the 6^{th} July.

The Year 6 children will be having a pizza/popcorn (with a few more luncheon treats) on the 23rd July, so there will be no need to send them to school with a packed lunch on the last day. I have also ordered a balloon display that will be placed on the grassed area outside of the side gate that leads into Crawcrook Park.

On the 23rd July, the Year 6 children will not leave school until 3.35pm. The reason for this, we want to give them a good send off from the side gate leading into Crawcrook Park. Parents will then have the opportunity to take photographs of the children beside the balloon display.

Summer Holiday Vouchers

Gateshead Council will be providing money to support the voucher scheme for families who are eligible for means tested free school meals. The vouchers will be ordered through Edenred and families can expect to receive the 6 week vouchers any time after the 23rd July.

Payment of meals when children move into KS2

The free school meal entitlement ends when children move into Year 3. Parents should then use the Parentmail App to pay for school lunches. The daily cost of a school lunch is £2.50

Eligibility for Means Tested Free School Meals

It is really important that if your child is eligible that you inform the Benefits Service at Gateshead Council when your child enters reception class. For every child that is eligible, school receives additional funding. Please look at the Pupil Premium information on the school website as that explains the money that the school receives for pupil premium children and there is information about how the money is spent. We have attached a Means Tested Free School Meals Application form to the bulletin, just in case you think you might be entitled to them.

Transition into Year 1

We are very excited for the Reception children to move into the Year 1 classes in September.

When children move from reception to year 1, we use the MarvellousMe App to communicate with parents. At the beginning of the autumn term, Mrs Lawrence and Miss McArdle will send out a letter with a joining code and instructions on how to download the App for MarvellousMe. Once the App is downloaded, you will receive all the messages from school.
