 - "Guy became a Catholic"

- 6. Why was Guy Fawkes doing a dangerous job when he was in the cellar when he was arrested? Guy Fawkes was doing a dangerous job in the cellar because he was sitting with 36 barrels of explosive gunpowder that could have been lit with a spark or other flame and blown him (and everything else) up!
- 7. Why did we choose the 5th of November to have Bonfire Night? The 5th of November was the night that Guy Fawkes was arrested.
- 8. Who still searches the Houses of Parliament every year before the Queen visits? Beefeaters search the Houses of Parliament once per year.

- 3. How old was Guy Fawkes when he his father died? Guy Fawkes was eight years old when his father died.
- 4. Find two quotes from the text that show that Guy Fawkes was a catholic.

 Quotes that show Guy Fawkes was a Catholic are (any two from):
 - "Guy became a Catholic"
 - "fought in the Eighty Years War for the Catholic side"
 - "These were Catholic men"
- 5. What role did Robert Catesby play in The Gunpowder Plot gang? Robert Catesby was the leader of The Gunpowder Plot gang.
- 6. Think about Guy Fawkes and where he was arrested, why do you think he might have died anyway, even if he had not been caught? Guy Fawkes is likely to have died in the explosion from the gunpowder as there was enough gunpowder to blow up the king and anything within a mile of the gunpowder. (Do not accept answers that may mention old age or being run over by a bus as the question asks the reader to think about where he was arrested and implies thinking about the gunpowder.)
- 7. Where is the House of Lords in relation to the Houses of Parliament? The House





of Lords is next door to the Houses of Parliament.

- 8. In the 'Guy Fawkes Facts' section, how many times a year does the search of the Houses of Parliament happen? The search of the Houses of Parliament happens once per year. (In the text is says 'annually'.)
