End of year reports

The teachers are in the process of preparing the children's end of year reports. We have made changes to the reports for this year. The changes are as a result of the pandemic and the fact that we have been unable to cover all of the curriculum due to school closure. It would be extremely unfair to the children if we were to make judgements on their progress using the normal end of year criteria. We have therefore incorporated the advice received from Education Gateshead into Emmaville's report format as we feel that this will give parents/carers a better understanding of how their child/children are doing.

<u>Uniform</u>

In September, we are going to continue with our current uniform arrangements, which is 2 days PE kit and 3 days purple uniform. 
Salto UK, our school uniform suppliers, have informed us that the deadline date for uniform orders is **Monday 5th July**.
