WORDS OF THE WEEK

immaculate (adjective)

To be perfectly, clean, neat or tidy.

"The lady, who was immaculately dressed, marched down the street, her son trailing behind her."



Frayed (adjective)

(Of a fabric, rope or cord) Unravelled or worn at the edge.

The frayed collar of her old coat.



irate (adjective)

To be feeling or characterised by great anger.

'Irated, the poised lady bellowed for her son to return.'



doleful (adverb)

To be experiencing sorrow or unhappiness. E.g a really sad look in someone's eyes.

"The child's doleful expression was bypassed by his mother."



glee (adjective)

Great delight, especially from one's own fortune or another's misfortune.

"They were dancing with glee."
