Daniel O'Hare Memorial Trophy - Durham County Champions

Wow! Wow! Wow!

What a performance from the Emmaville Football Team who are now County Champions of Durham. After four weeks of competition, progressing through the Blaydon and District West round, the Blaydon and District finals, the Durham County semi-finals and ultimately the Durham County finals, the team achieved what their hard work, skills and teamwork deserved - becoming Durham County Champions and winning the Daniel O'Hare Memorial Trophy.

The finals consisted of Emmaville (Blaydon), Biddick (Washington), St Mary Magdelene (Seaham) and Easington Colliery (Peterlee), who had been winners of the competition four of the previous seven years. The first match was against Biddick who had beaten Emmaville 1-0 in the semi-finals so we knew it was going to be a hard match. The team were amazing and fought for every single ball for the whole match. This hard work resulted in an excellent 1-0 win for Emmaville with the winning goal coming from Sam. The next match was against St Mary Magdelene who again were tough opposition but Emmaville played some lovely football and won 4-1 with goals coming from Harvey and Lewis who both scored two each.

So, it all came down to the final match - Emmaville against the current holders, Easington Colliery. Whoever won would be the County champions. And what a performance from the team! The players worked for every ball and never gave an inch. From this effort they were then able to show their quality with some beautiful football and ultimately score two fantastic goals, both from George. The game was very close and Emmaville were thankful to Jake in goal who pulled off some amazing saves as well. The game ended 2-0 to Emmaville to win the County Cup - The Daniel O'Hare Memorial Trophy - and become champions of Durham County for the first time in Emmaville's history. Not only this, but Emmaville become the first team from Blaydon and District to win the trophy. What an achievement! To top it off, Emmaville will now represent Durham County in the North of England finals which is organised by the English Schools Football Association (ESFA).

The whole school are extremely proud of the team, not only for how well they have done but also how they have represented the school which was highlighted by organisers and participants of the tournament who contacted Emmaville to congratulate the team. Furthermore, news of Emmaville's success travelled far and wide, so much so that there was a special mention from Sky Sports by Keith Downie, Jamie Carragher and Gary Neville. WOW!

The team deserves all the credit and praise they have received, and every member of the team and squad, whether playing, substitute or coming to training, has made a huge contribution to the success. Very well done!




Remembrance Day Poppies will be on sale at school from Monday 8th November.
