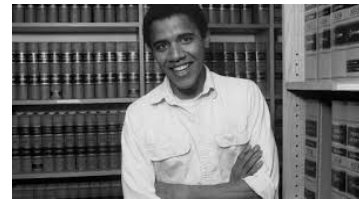
**Today, we are going to learn about a very famous man who was born in Hawaii.**

## Before he was president...



- Barack Obama was born in Hawaii on August 4, 1961.
- He lived in Hawaii and in Jakarta, Indonesia.
- He graduated from Harvard Law School. He became a civil rights lawyer and a law professor.



- Barack Obama was the 44th president of the USA
- He is the first African - American president
- He ended US involvement of war in Iraq
- He made health insurance more widely available in the USA

- President Obama's campaigns stood for hope and progress.

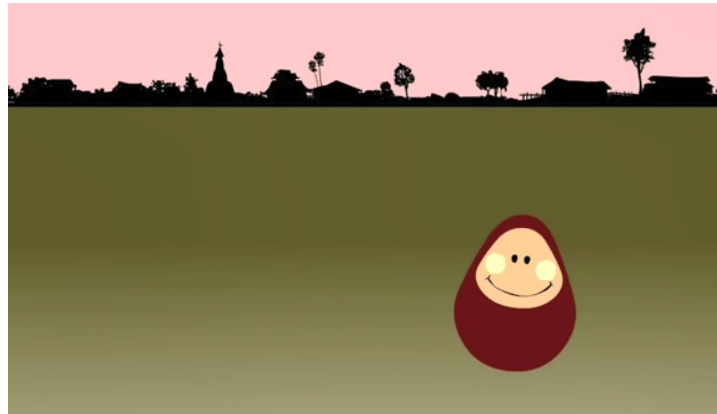

**Rosa Parks**  
1913-2005

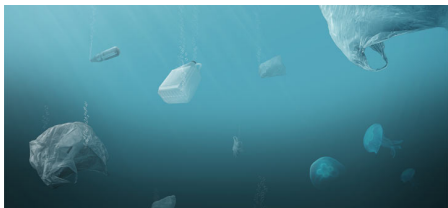
Rosa Parks was born in America and, as a child, she was used to having to sit at the back of a bus because she had black skin, but she didn't think that this was fair. One day on a bus, she refused to give her seat to a white person just because she was black. She was arrested by the police and fined for breaking the rules, but other black people and some white people as well, agreed with Rosa and made this clear to the American government. Eventually, they changed the rule and black people no longer had to sit in a separate section of the bus or give up their seat to someone just because of the colour of their skin.

**She wanted to make the world a better place.**


**This is why Barack Obama is so famous. It was a huge turning point for the USA to have a black president.**

**During his term in office, he wanted to continue thinking about he could make the world a better place, like others had done before him.**
