Throughout children's time at Emmaville there may be the need for us to rearrange classes. Whenever possible this will be done during the early years and KS1 when children's friendships are less established due to their social and emotional development at that age. The children in Early Years and Key Stage 1, are already familiar with groupings for phonics and quite happily move groups throughout the school year, mixing not only with children in their own year group but also with children in other year groups.
