Year 6 Young Mathematical Story Authors Showcase their work at Curriculum Conference

Last week, some of our Year 6 children were invited to the Dryden Centre in Gateshead to attend a 'Curriculum Conference'. The children were showcasing a book they have been creating over the half term as part of the Young Mathematical Story Author competition - a national competition for children age 8 - 13 years. They were introduced to their audience by a school inspector who described them as 'trail-blazers' for the Gateshead Young Mathematical Story competition. Their book 'Spot Lends a Paw', is a mathematical story about number bonds to 10, aimed at an audience of younger children. After reading 'Spot Lends a Paw' to the audience, our Year 6 authors and illustrators were grilled about their book by headteachers and teachers from across Gateshead. We were amazed by their confidence when answering questions about the process of creating their book and the advice they would give to other prospective authors.


Emmaville's Swimming Success!
