This half term I have had the pleasure of working with some of our Year 4 children at an after-school speed stack club.

Speed stack or sport stacking is an individual and a team sport that involves stacking up to 12 specially designed cups in predetermined sequences, as quickly as possible. It is an excellent activity to develop hand-eye coordination, speed and fitness and it's so much fun too!

Our children have learned and practised stacking pyramid sequences of 3, 6 and 10 cups; working individually and also racing against their peers.

Children also competed in relay races, stacking the jumbo speed stacks.

I have been incredibly impressed at the children's enthusiasm, progress and determination when attending this club. Thank you to each of you, you have been an absolute pleasure to work with.
